

Vaccination Documentation

To be in compliance with the City of Philadelphia's recent mandate on vaccination status of indoor diners, beginning on Thursday, January 6th, 2022 Walnut Hill College Restaurants will require proof of vaccination documentation upon entry to any of its dining facilities. Additionally, guests choosing to purchase goods for dine-in purposes in the colleges Pastry Shop, will be subject to proof of vaccination. Individuals purchasing goods for take-away must be masked at all times, however, do not need to show proof of vaccination.

The mandate states:

Starting Monday January 3rd, Philadelphia establishments that sell food or drink for consumption onsite will require that everyone who enters has completed their COVID vaccinations. Completing vaccinations means that they have received two doses of either the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine or a single dose of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine.

At all Walnut Hill College dining facilities:

- In lieu of a vaccination record, between January 6th through January 17th, WHC operations will accept proof of a negative COVID-19 test within 24 hours of entry for people who are not fully vaccinated;
- Children aged 5 years and 3 months through 11 will be required to have one dose of COVID vaccine by January 3rd and to complete their vaccine series by February 3.
- ***After January 17, proof of full vaccination will be required for all individuals over the age of 5 years and 3 months.***
- Individuals providing proof of valid religious or medical exemptions and children under five years and three months are exempt from this requirement.

As proof of vaccination all guests must provide:

1. A copy or photo of a completed vaccination record.
2. A photo identification card indicating the corresponding name to the vaccination card/record.
3. Documentation of a valid religious or medical exemption.

Please be prepared to provide verification of vaccination documents upon arrival to Walnut Hill College dining facilities.

COVID vaccines are one of the best ways to prevent and slow the spread of COVID-19. Paired with the City's indoor mask mandate, the high rates of vaccination in Philadelphia have kept Philadelphia's case rate among the lowest in Pennsylvania.
